IN <u>CAMBRIDGE</u>, July 4, 2011.

The unanimous Declaration of the **Jvy League**,

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for all peoples to strengthen political <u>control over rampant individualism</u>, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and Gaia entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of personkind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to expand government.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all people should be made equal, that they are endowed by their government with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are jobs, healthcare and housing.--That to secure these rights, Governments must rule over the people, deriving their just powers from the consent of the elite, -- That whenever the people becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the Elite to alter or to abolish it, and to institute more Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect the power and control of the elite.

Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments should not be reduced or constrained; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that personkind are more disposed to suffer, while <u>capitalism</u> is sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of <u>liberties and freedoms</u>, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to liberate them from the elite, it is government's obligation, it is their duty, to impose more Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.--Such has been the patient sufferance of the elite; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to expand their former Systems of Government. The history of the Founding Fathers is a history of repeated limitations on state power, all having in direct object the restriction of an absolute Tyranny over the people. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

They refused to facilitate more Laws, based on our evolving definition of what is necessary for the public good.

They have forbidden the bureaucracy to impose Laws of political importance, unless the Constituion is amended.

They refused to allow other Laws for the accommodation of dependency among the people, depriving those people of the right of paid vacations, maternal leave, and cable TV.

They imposed limitations the power of government that were unusual, uncomfortable to the ruling class, for the sole purpose of limiting government power.

They restricted the power of Congress repeatedly, thus hindering invasions on the rights of the people.

<u>They</u> refused for a long time, after such <u>restrictions</u>, to <u>allow courts to create new rights</u> for Internet access and electric cars, to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed to all the dangers of <u>inadequate power to control</u> <u>people's lives</u>.

<u>They</u> endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing <u>automatic voter registration for illegal immigrants</u>

<u>They</u> obstructed the <u>imposition of bureaucracy</u>, by refusing <u>their</u> Assent to Laws for <u>empowering the</u> Judiciary <u>to expand government</u>.

<u>They required Judges to obey the Constitution, instead of treating it as an evolving</u> <u>document</u>.

<u>They failed to erect a multitude of New Offices, and sent hither inadequate swarms of</u> Officers to harrass our people, and eat out their substance.

They failed to impose among us, in times of peace, a big enough EPA, BATF, or OSHA.

<u>They</u> affected to render the <u>people</u> independent of and superior to the <u>state's</u> power.

<u>They</u> combined with <u>citizens</u> to <u>limit the elite with a</u> constitution, <u>making it difficult to</u> <u>impose our preferred</u> Legislation:

For Quartering large bodies of <u>bureaucrats</u> among us: For protecting them, by a mock Trial, from punishment for any Murders which they should commit on the Inhabitants of these States:

For cutting off our Trade with all parts of the world:

For imposing Taxes on us without our Consent:

For depriving us in many cases, of the benefits of Trial by Jury:

For transporting us beyond Seas to be tried for pretended offences

For abolishing the free System of English Laws in a neighbouring Province, establishing therein an Arbitrary government, and enlarging its Boundaries so as to render it at once an example and fit instrument for introducing the same absolute rule into these Colonies:

For taking away our Charters, abolishing our most valuable Laws, and altering fundamentally the Forms of our Governments:

For suspending our own Legislatures, and declaring themselves invested with power to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever.

<u>They made it difficult for us to plunder the seas, ravage the Coasts, burn the towns, and destroy</u> the lives of people.

<u>They would forbid</u> transporting large Armies of <u>U.N.</u> Mercenaries to compleat the works of death, desolation and tyranny, already begun with circumstances of Cruelty & perfidy scarcely paralleled in the most barbarous ages, and totally unworthy the Head of a civilized nation.

<u>They</u> constrained to the federal government so it could not bear Arms against the Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

They failed to allow an income tax until 1913, which delayed our ability to bring on the inhabitants of our <u>nation</u>, the merciless <u>JRS agents</u>, whose known rule of warfare, is an undistinguished destruction of all ages, sexes and conditions.

In every stage of these <u>unpleasant freedoms</u> We have Petitioned for Redress in the most humble terms: Our repeated Petitions have been answered only by repeated injury. A <u>Constitution</u> whose character is thus marked by every act which may define <u>freedom</u>, is unfit to <u>enable the enslavement</u> of a free people.

Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our Brittish brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

We, therefore, the Representatives of the <u>political elite</u>, in <u>faculty lounges</u>, Assembled, appealing to the <u>United Nations</u> for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of <u>government</u>, solemnly publish and declare, That the <u>American people</u> ought to be <u>governed by the United Nations</u>; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the <u>Constitution</u>, and that all political connection between them and the <u>Founding Fathers</u>, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as <u>highly-taxed</u> and dependent States, they have full Power to levy <u>taxes</u>, <u>disrupt</u> Peace, contract <u>new departments and agencies</u>, <u>regulate</u> Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which the political elite may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of <u>the establishment media</u>, we mutually <u>demand your Lives</u>, your Fortunes and your sacred Honor.
